Transcript

(English subtitles)

Josianne: My name is Josianne. I'm 21. I live in St-Hilaire and I have known Joanie for 12 years, because we've been living together.

Joanie: I'm Joanie. As Josianne said, we have lived together for 12 years, because Josianne is in a "home-stay" (foster home) program at our place (family home). So we have been friends for 12 years. We live in the same house. I was 13 years old when Josianne arrived. Because we grew up together, it was easy to become friends.

(to Josianne) And at home, what do we do--in the summer for example?

Joanie: Well, we're two sensitive people.

I'm really me with Josianne and I know that she accepts me as I am. And this is the same for me: I love her and I accept her as she is. So this is what makes this friendship beautiful.
